Back-to-School News

The 2009-10 school year will officially begin when classes resume for all students in grades K4 and 1-9 on Tuesday, September 1, 2009. Students in grades 10, 11, and 12 will report for class on Wednesday, September 2, and Early Childhood and Kindergarten students will officially begin on Thursday, September 3, with a scheduled orientation time (kindergarten only) on either September 1 or 2. Teachers will report for staff development activities on August 26 and 27 in preparation for students.

► Student Registration

All students in grades K4-12 will be required to register for school. Elementary age students will register on Monday, August 3, beginning at 11:00 a.m. and concluding at 6:00 p.m. Middle school and high school students will register on Wednesday, August 5. Please refer to page two for a complete listing of registration information for all schools.

Prior to the end of July, all families will have received a mailing outlining registration procedures. Items contained in the mailing will include a cover letter from the building principal, student information sheets and/or emergency cards, and procedures. Please plan on completing the information sheets and emergency cards and returning them when registering your child(ren). All kindergarten parents will receive, in a separate mailing, information regarding their appointment for orientation. Kindergarten students will report for their first day of class on Thursday, September 3, with their orientation time scheduled on September 1 or 2.

Parents of elementary students will be expected to complete an Elementary Student Registration Receipt form. A sample of this form will be included in the referenced mailing. At registration, elementary and middle school families will receive a student handbook, 2009-2010 Activity Calendar, and Family

Information Publication. High school students will receive these items upon their return to school.

Herff Jones Photography will be on hand at registration to take photographs of middle and high school students. Package prices and proofs will be mailed to the student's home. If you have moved to a new address, or anticipate a move, please contact your school office immediately with your updated information.

*The middle and high school fees include an activity pass for the 2009-2010 school year. The high school fee also includes \$2 toward the student planner.

General registration fees will be collected at registration time, and deposits to food service accounts can also be made, but will require a separate check. A separate check will also be needed for milk purchases.

Additionally, athletic fees and course fees for art, metals, woods, and foods classes can be paid at registration.

High school athletes will be charged a

fee of \$20 per sport and middle school athletes (grades 6-8) will be charged \$10 per sport. Physical cards may be turned in on registration day.

*To make a screening appointment for your child(ren), call the Jefferson School District office at (920) 675-1043, between 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m., and ask for Lori Erdmann.*

This screening is for all 3- and 4-year-old children who are not currently enrolled in the Early Childhood (EC) program or receiving special education services. It will give parents information about how their child is developing in gross motor (coordination, balance, etc.), fine motor (mainly doing things with one's hands), speech and language, social/behavior, and cognitive (problem solving) areas. EC screening is for all children in the 3- to 4-year-old range, regardless of whether you believe your child is having developmental difficulties.

School Health News

Wisconsin Student Immunization Law has changed regarding the vaccine requirements for the upcoming 2009-10 school year. Two new vaccine requirements were added which may affect your child's compliance with the law. The Wisconsin Student Immunization Law will require:

### **Students entering Grs. 6, 7, and 12:**

- Vaccine(s): Tdap (1 dose) and Varicella (2 doses)

### **Students entering Grs. 9 and 10:**

- Vaccine: Tdap (1 dose)

If your child will be entering grade 6, 7, 9, 10, or 12 and already received a tetanus-containing vaccine (ie. Td

vaccine) within the last five years, your child is compliant and the Tdap vaccine is not required.

If your child had the Chickenpox disease, even after the first dose of the varicella vaccine, further doses of the vaccine are not required.

We encourage you to make plans now to have your child vaccinated well in advance of school opening to avoid the late summer rush at doctors' offices and immunization clinics. At registration time, or at the start of the school year, please provide the school office with the dates of your child's vaccinations. ## Prescription for Danger

Prescription drug misuse is becoming a major problem throughout the country. Not too long ago Brett Favre, former quarterback for the Green Bay Packers, admitted to misuse and addiction to the pain killer Vicodin.

Percocet, Vicodin, and OxyContin are powerful narcotic drugs. Although they can be used appropriately under medical direction, drugs in this classification have significant potential for addiction.

Narcotics are controlled substances for a reason. The costs associated with their use are sometimes more than the benefits derived from their legitimate medical use. These drugs are also chemically related to opium. Heroin is a drug that is produced from morphine which is a principal component of opium, a substance that is extracted from the seed pod of the opium poppy. Heroin has become increasingly available in Wisconsin. It is a relatively inexpensive illegal drug and it has cross

tolerance to drugs like OxyContin. This means that if an individual gets "hooked on" OxyContin and can no longer get a medical prescription for it, the person can use heroin as a substitute. It is a sad and dangerous problem.

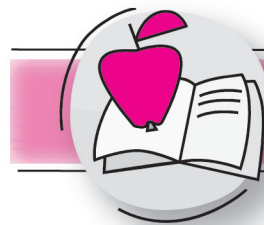
You may ask yourself, where do teens and others get drugs like OxyContin and Vicodin? Unfortunately, many times from the family medicine cabinet. There are even times when teens take drugs from the home medicine cabinet and get together for a party. They then toss these drugs in a bowl which, in street language, is called a "Candy Store" and engage in using a combination of dangerous drugs.

Recent news reports from the Milwaukee area have shown the disastrous results of these practices. The use of Heroin has also been seen locally in Milton. This past spring, three Milton middle school students were lucky to be alive after "snorting" Heroin that one of them "found" in a home. Heroin is sold in Jefferson County! Prescription drugs like OxyContin, Vicodin and Percocet are misused in Jefferson County.

Would you like to do something about this? You can!! If you have these drugs at home, lock them up or protect them in some other way. If you don't need them anymore, dispose of them. Drugs expire rather quickly, so check them regularly and contact your local pharmacy for assistance in disposing of them. Don't tempt teens that live or visit your home by keeping prescription medications in harm's way.

If you need assistance, feel free to contact the Jefferson Police Department to discuss any of your questions or concerns about this topic. School staff members can also help. Feel free to contact any of our school guidance counselors with your questions.

Protect your children! Ask for help; we will be there.

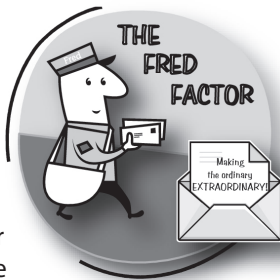
