## Back-to-School News

The 2008-09 school year will officially begin when classes resume for all students in grades K4 and 1-9 on Tuesday, September 2, 2008. Students in grades 10, 11, and 12 will report for class on Wednesday, September 3, and Early Childhood and Kindergarten students will officially begin on Thursday, September 4, with a scheduled orientation time (kindergarten only) on either September 2 or 3. Teachers will report for staff development activities on August 27 and 28 in preparation for students.

All students in grades K4-12 will be required to register for school. Please refer to the following dates and times at left.

In an effort to streamline the registration process, all families will receive a mailing in early August outlining registration procedures. Items contained in the mailing will include a cover letter from the building principal, student information sheets and/or emergency cards, and procedures. Please plan on completing the information sheets and emergency cards and returning them when registering your child(ren). All kindergarten parents will receive, in a separate mailing, information regarding their appointment for orientation. Kindergarten students will report for their first day of class on Thursday, September 4, with their orientation time scheduled on September 2 or 3.

Parents of elementary students will be expected to complete an Elementary Student Registration Receipt form. A sample of this form will be included in the referenced mailing. At registration, elementary and middle school families will receive a student handbook, 2008-2009 Activity Calendar, and Family Information Publication.

High school students will receive these items upon their return to school.

Herff Jones Photography will be on hand at registration to take photographs of middle and high school students. Package prices and proofs will be mailed to the student's home.

## School Fees

General registration fees will be collected at registration time, and

deposits to food service accounts can also be made, but will require a separate check. A separate check will also be needed for milk purchases.

Additionally, athletic fees and course fees for art, metals, woods, foods classes, and the foreign language and Anatomy and Physiology workbook fees can be paid at registration.

High school athletes will be charged a fee of \$20 per sport and middle school athletes (grades 7-8) will be charged \$10 per sport. Physical cards may be turned in on registration day.

# District Maintenance Projects

## What have we been doing?

Throughout the recent referendum promotion/process and during the follow-up information gathering sessions, the issue of district maintenance projects surfaced repeatedly. Many district residents expressed an interest in the types of maintenance projects that have been completed throughout the District and how well our schools have been maintained. Concerns were shared that potentially the maintenance projects were set aside in order to address other District needs. This article and information below is provided to inform our readers.

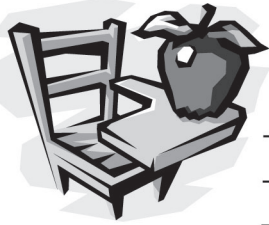
Annually the District has to balance its budget by prioritizing all of its needs, including staffing, technology, curriculum, general operations, and maintenance. With the revenue limits placed on our funding sources, it is impossible to do everything that we would like in any area, but that does not mean that any given area has been ignored, maintenance projects included. In fact, over the past ten years, the District has spent over \$1.5 million on maintenance projects out of its general budget plus an additional \$85,000 was spent on refurbishing the auditorium seats (\$60,000 was donated and \$25,000 taken from Fund 80). These projects were in addition to the major renovations and additions that have been done at West and East Elementary schools and the 1999 construction of the new Jefferson Middle School that were funded through the District's support of referendum questions in 1997 and 1998.

Each year, the proposed projects are evaluated along with all other expenditures in the budget. As we, along with districts throughout the state, continue to struggle with the funding system imposed upon us, we feel fortunate to have been able to accomplish the significant amount of projects listed and still maintain the quality of education for which the District is known.

Over the course of the past year, the Board of Education has developed long-term maintenance plans for each of its buildings. Watch for details of the long-term maintenance plan in the October edition of the *District Newsletter*.

# K4 Program Begins at Sullivan Elementary

Starting with the 2008-2009 school year, Sullivan Elementary School will be one of four sites to offer four-year-old kindergarten instruction to resident students. The K4 classes will run Monday - Thursday during the school year, with sessions in the morning and afternoon. Fridays will be utilized for the teacher to extend community outreach to the parents of enrolled K4 students.



This is a new program for the Jefferson School District and was developed over the past two years through a community-wide committee made up of School District of Jefferson staff members, area day care providers, community members, and staff from the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction.

In addition to Sullivan Elementary, three Jefferson sites will house the District's K4 program: Kiddie Kollege, Jefferson County Head Start (housed at East Elementary School), and Small World Preschool.

Beginning with the 2008-09 school year, Sullivan Elementary will also offer an after-



school program that will be run by Sally Peterson of Premier Day Care in Sullivan. This program will operate Monday through Friday from after school until 6:00 p.m. On days when school is not in session during the school year, service will be provided all day at Sullivan Elementary.

## 4th Annual Character Education Conference A Success

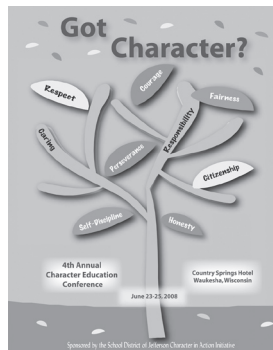

Over 300 educators from Wisconsin, Illinois, Michigan, Nebraska, North Carolina, Florida, California, and New York attended this conference that was held at the Country Springs Hotel and Conference Center in Waukesha.

One of the highlights of this year's conference was East Elementary School and the School District as a whole receiving the prestigious *Promising Practices Award* from the Wisconsin Character Education Partnership. The award was presented during a luncheon awards ceremony by Dr. Sam Scheibler from the Milwaukee School of Engineering. Only nine awards were given out statewide. We are so very proud of our community involvement in this initiative and of our staff for their commitment to the students of our district.

Among the breakout session presenters were district employees and community members that included Fran Vandre, Michelle VanMatre-Keis, Steve Landfried, Mike Swartz, Tom Pinnow, and Sandy Swartz. Additionally, Board of Education President David Krause gave the welcome address.
