



Jefferson Teachers Co-Present at National Conference

Jo Christianson, early childhood teacher at East Elementary School, and Bonnie Dimond, second grade teacher at West Elementary School, were co-presenters at the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards (NBPTS) National Conference and Exhibition held on July 15-18, 2009, in Atlanta, Georgia. The theme of the conference was "New Voices, New Visions: Teaching for Tomorrow, Today."

NBPTS is an independent nonprofit, nonpartisan, and nongovernmental organization whose mission is to increase student achievement in our nation's schools.

Mrs. Christianson and Mrs. Dimond, along with other Wisconsin National Board Certified Teachers (NBCTs), presented a session entitled "The Ultimate Collaborative Opportunity – Statewide NBCT Networks." Topics included the organizational structure of Wisconsin's National Board Network, various opportunities for Wisconsin's

National Board candidates, print and web-based materials developed by Wisconsin's NBCTs, collaborative efforts with Wisconsin's university/higher education institutions, and Mrs. Christianson's and Mrs. Dimond's presentation on candidate support across the state. The 90-minute presentation was attended by representatives from the states of Alabama, Georgia, Idaho, Maryland, New York, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Utah, Virginia, and Washington.

In addition to the NBPTS conference, Mrs. Christianson also attended the Wisconsin Education Association Council's summer academy in La Crosse. She worked with four other NBCTs providing information/support sessions over the three-day Academy for 18 NBCT candidates for the upcoming year.

To become a NBCT, educators voluntarily agree to be assessed in content area knowledge, student lesson design and analysis, reflective practice, and professional

commitment to students, parents, community, and the teaching profession.

Less than two percent of the nation's teachers have achieved National Certification. Educators from both the public and private sectors are eligible to participate in the process.

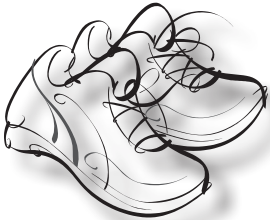
Celebrate Character and "WALK THE TALK"

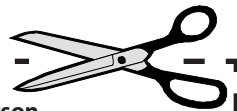

Listed below is a fun "recipe" that may help us as we remember to celebrate character at home, at work, and at school.

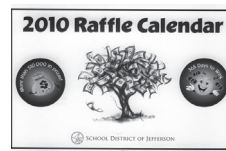
Recipe for Being an Individual of Character

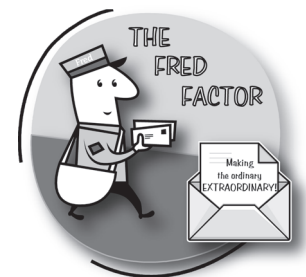
Help Our Students and Our Staff

Vocal Jazz Ensemble performed at the state WCDA convention in 2008.

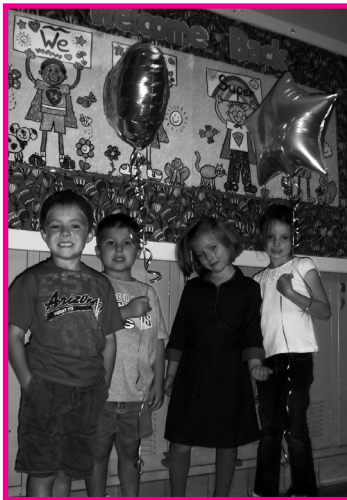
